Mental health is a state of mental, emotional, psychological and social wellbeing. It is pivotal to personal, community and socio economic development. Continued exposure to unfavorable socio-economic, geopolitical and environmental circumstances, poverty, inequality, violence, discrimination and exclusion increase the risk of mental health issues in people. Genetics also plays a crucial role in increasing the risk of having mental disorders. In contemporary times, harsh parenting, relationship discords, bullying, academic and career stress, pandemics and disease outbreaks, humanitarian emergencies, climate crisis, forced displacement and substance abuse significantly contribute to precipitate mental health issues in people. Talking about mental health is considered to be a stigma, preventing people to seek timely help from professionals like clinical psychologists and psychiatrists. The scenario of mental health issues in J&K is alarming. Natural disasters such as earthquakes, floods and pandemics like Covid-19 have increased the risk of mental health issues in people in J&K.

The existing gap in mental health care has also added to the scenario because of lack of Mental Health Literacy (MHL), stigma, and lack of sound research and policy reform to be implemented at the grassroots and unexplored use of psychological therapies.

To foster adolescent mental health and psychological wellbeing one must stay away from drug abuse, and foods that contain neuro-endocrine disruptors. With the onset of mobiles, children don't do physical activities and channelize their energy positively. Students need to reclaim mud and sweat in the real playground. A multi-sector approach is needed to boost and sustain mental and psychological well-being. Good social connections, and physical exercise, relaxation practices such as yoga, mindfulness, deep breathing, meditation and music and spiritual therapy help develop positive coping mechanisms to deal with stress in our lives. From a few thousands in nineties to around few lacs in the year 2023 reflect the unprecedented rise in the number of Mental Health problems in J&K. Taking timely help and breaking the stereotype surrounding stigma will definitely help to identify their problems and cultivate a culture of acceptance and chalking out the best strategies to deal with the issues. Moreover, parents and teachers need to listen to youngsters and spend quality time with them to imbibe and nourish values in them.

The Government is trying to facilitate people to deal with mental health issues. One of the initiatives taken is Tele Mental Health Assistance and Networking across States (Tele MANAS), which aims to provide free Tele Mental Health Service 24x7 in J&K also.
